Dr. Vicki Hatton was raised in Mangum, Oklahoma and graduated from Mangum High School. She received her Bachelor of Science Degree and Master's in Education at SWOSU. She received her Doctor of Education from Oklahoma State University. Dr. Hatton started her career in public schools and taught 12 years in both Oklahoma and Texas. She taught health and physical education and coached girls basketball, volleyball, tennis, and track and field. Most recently, Dr. Hatton retired after spending 29 years at SWOSU where she served as a Professor/ Department Chair of Kinesiology.

Dr. Hatton has received many awards and recognition during her teaching career. She served as the State President of the Oklahoma Health Association for Health, Physical Education, Recreation, and Dance. She was inducted into the Mangum Education Hall of Fame, and won the highest award possible—the Honor Award—from the Oklahoma Health Association for Health, Physical Education, Recreation, and Dance. She served as President of LAMBDA Chapter of Delta Kappa Gamma and has been a member for over 25 years. Two other highlights include being appointed by Governor Henry to serve on the "Task Force on the Promotion of Children's Health" and being a Representative at the National Physical Education to Progress Rally in Washington, D.C.

Dr. Hatton served as the SWOSU Faculty Athletic Representative and Chair of the Athletic Council. She chaired the President Inaugural Committee for Dr. John Hays and was a member of the committee for President Randy Beutler. She also chaired the committee for the SWOSU Wellness Center. Dr. Hatton co-developed the "Building Bodies Program, that addressed special needs students at Burcham Elementary and did volunteer work with Special Olympics over the years. She also was the volunteer co-chair of the Weatherford Walking for Wellness Program.

Dr. Hatton believes students learn by doing and being involved. So if you were in her classes you expected hands on experience. She believed every student could be successful with hard work and perseverance.

When Dr. Hatton visited with potential students and incoming freshman, she told them to go with what they have a passion for in finding a career. She believed kids don't have to follow mom and dad or grandma and grandpa's profession. She also believed that a young person has to know what is in his or her heart for the direction they want to go. She told them that it needs to be a profession that they will enjoy getting up and going to work for each day because more than likely it will be their lifetime job.

Hatton enjoys doing things with her family. She enjoys golfing, walking, reading, yard work, having lunch with friends, and attending women's collegiate basketball games.
